

Explore the Golders Green blue walk with these fun activities!

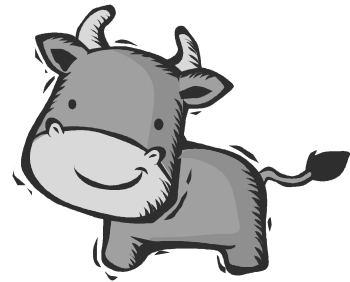
1. The first house

When the Underground was extended to Golders Green many new houses were built so more people could live in the area. The first house to be built is now the Central Hotel on the corner of Hoop Lane. If you could design a house what would it look like?

2. Express dairies

Golders Green was once surrounded by fields with many dairy farms. They provided people living here with milk. Today it's very different. Create your own song to the tune of *Old MacDonald had a farm* with the things you see around Golders Green on your walk and then sing it!



3. Spot the mezuzah

Jewish people have lived in Golders Green for a long time. A mezuzah is found on doorposts in Jewish homes. It is a little case, containing a tiny scroll. The writing on the scroll is in Hebrew and is called the Shema. It says that Jewish people should love God and keep His rules. See how many mezuzahs you can spot on the houses on Hampstead Way.
