

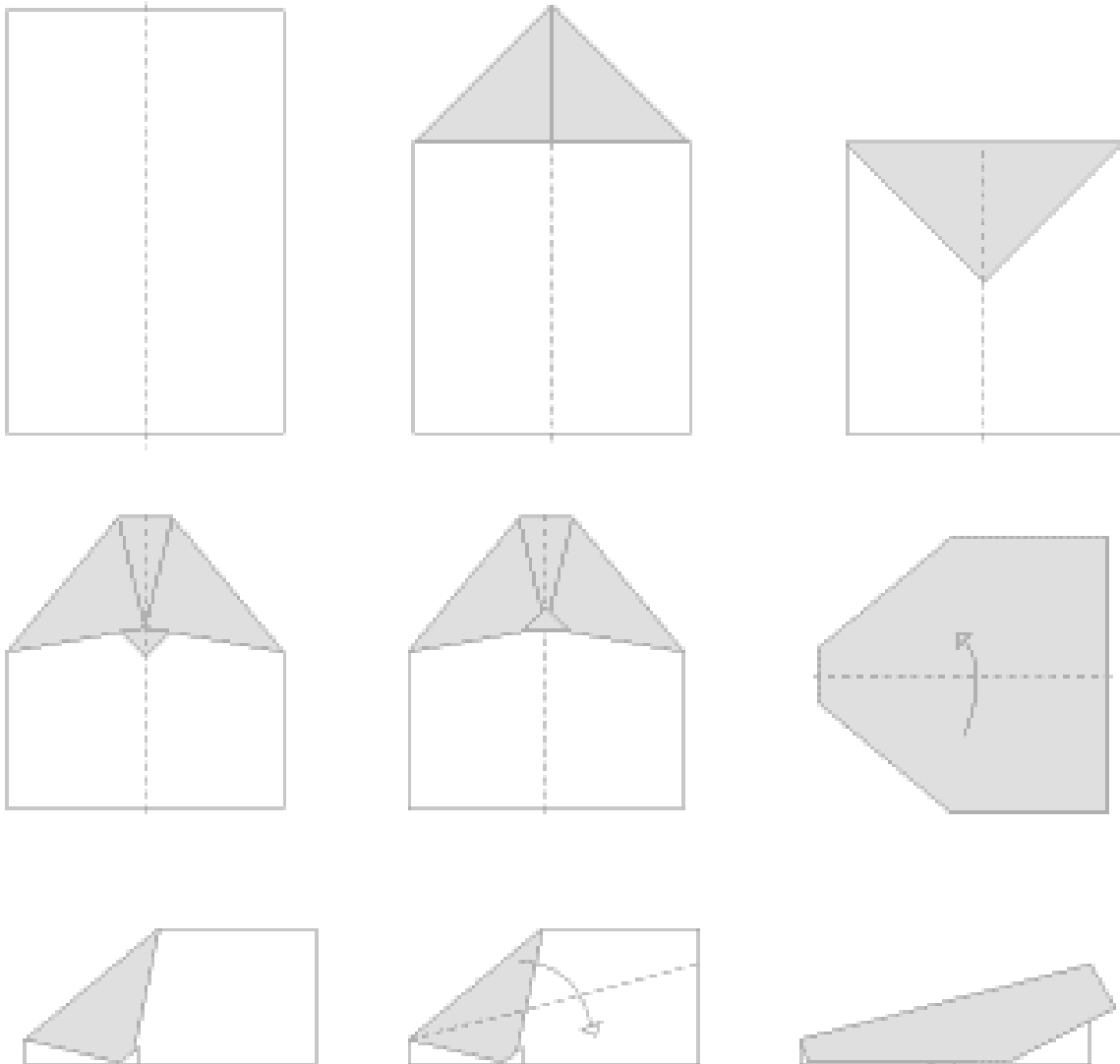


Explore the Golders Green pink walk with these fun activities!

1. Anti-aircraft battery origami

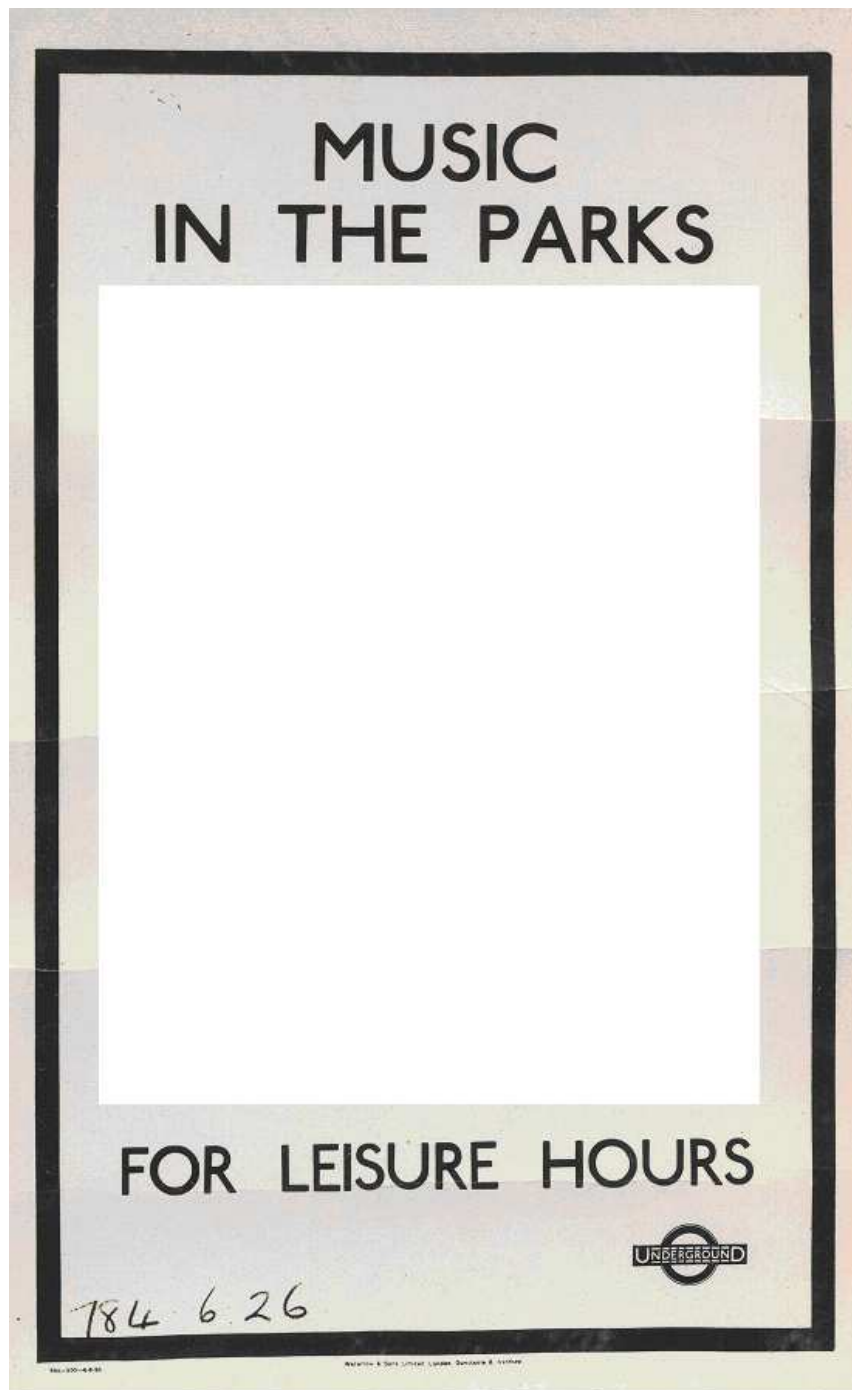
