On the Routemaster there were 2 crew - a bus driver and a ticket conductor.

The conductor:

- Collected money
- Gave out paper tickets
- Punched tickets so that people knew when they had been used
- Helped people to know when to get off the bus

What do you think it would have been like to be a bus conductor?

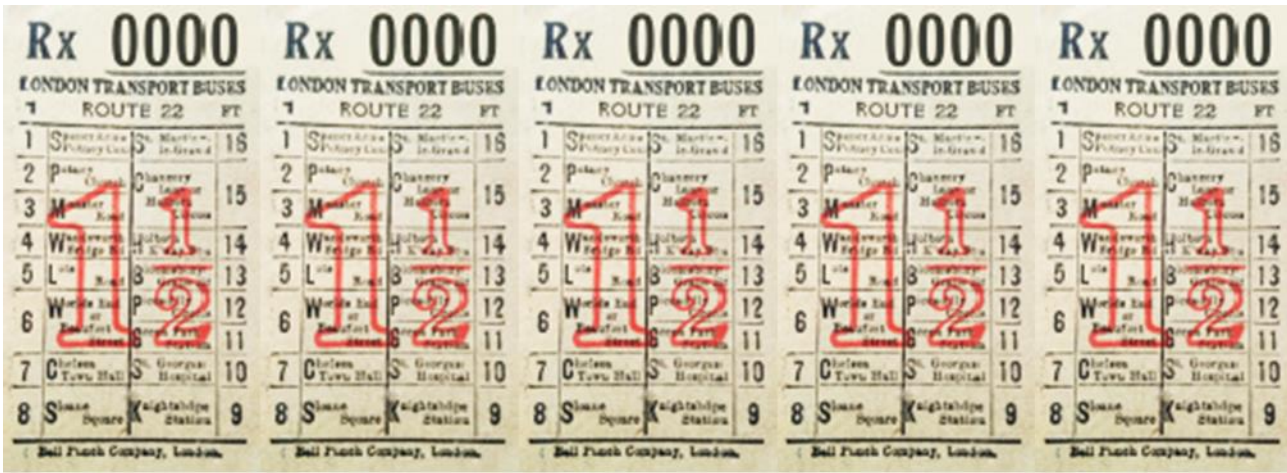
