What will the event be like?

Upon arrival you'll be offered refreshments whilst you enjoy a talk about the restoration of Carriage 353.

Before the tour starts you'll be split into small groups of 4 – 6 people, and introduced to your personal guide. You'll visit a variety of driver's cabs, as well as the beautifully restored Carriage 353. Vehicles include Standard Stock, 1986 Prototype Tube Stock, and 1940 Tube Stock from the Waterloo & City line, amongst others.

During lunch there will be short film screenings and the rare opportunity to visit the Museum's fascinating small objects store.

General information

Cab It! is unfortunately not suitable for wheelchair users, as due to the nature of the collection the vehicles are not accessible for wheelchairs.

Due to the small size of the driver's cabs on the tour, we ask for any guests with large bags to please place them in our free lockers at the start of the tour.

Food and drink is not available to purchase at the Museum Depot. Lunch and refreshments are included for Cab It! We can cater for dietary requirements, please include this information when prompted during booking.

Toilet facilities are available at the entrance.

Photography is allowed for private purposes, however no tripods are allowed.

The Museum Depot train shed is not heated, we advise guests to wrap up during the colder months.
